




Pupils' Conference Elefsina "Transition to a Climate-Neutral Future"

X- Bowling Art Centre, Elefsina 9, 10, 11 May 2023



The **Pupils' Conference** for the "**Transition to a Climate- Neutral Future**" is organized in the context of the "2023 Eleusis Cultural Capital of Europe" by the Centre for Renewable Energy Sources and Saving (CRES) (implementing organization) in collaboration with the Environmental Education Coordinators of the Primary Education Directorate of West Attica, 1st and 3rd Primary Education Directorates of Athens, the Secondary Education Directorate of East Thessaloniki and the German Independent Institute for Environmental Issues (UfU). This action is MYSTERY no. 149 of the Cultural Capital programme and it is held under the auspices of the Greek Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs (27473/GD4/ 10.3.2023). The major part of the project is directly financed by the German Federal Ministry of Economic Affairs and Climate Action through funds from the European Climate Initiative programme (EUKI).

Introduction - Brief description of educational program - The Pupils' Conference

The climate crisis entails a major risk for our planet and its inhabitants. As mentioned in the Fit for 55 package of the European Union (EU) which emphasizes the need to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in order to have climate neutrality achieved by 2050, future generations will be affected by more frequent and more intense storms, forest fires, droughts and floods, as well as by the subsequent conflicts throughout the world. Addressing these crises is therefore a question of intergenerational and international solidarity.

In order to achieve this goal and bring about the transformation required across our economy, society and industry, it is essential to involve citizens and encourage changes in their daily routines. These include reducing energy consumption and increasing the use of renewable energy systems (RES) currently as well as in the future. The European Green Deal set out the strategic plan for this transformation. It set the building blocks for tomorrow's economy with key strategies on biodiversity, the circular economy, zero pollution, sustainable and smart mobility, the renovation wave, sustainable food, hydrogen, batteries, offshore renewables and many others.

Strengthening climate action constitutes the key claim of youth, including today's teenagers, who, through movements, are calling on governments and the EU to act decisively and without delay with a view to protecting the climate.

But how is climate neutrality in a place connected to its cultural heritage, the upgrading of urban space, the revitalization of environmentally and socially burdened areas, the everyday life in the city and people's relationships? How can all residents enjoy a quality of life without discrimination (energy poverty, degraded areas, atmospheric and industrial pollution, etc.)? How can solutions for today and the future be achieved through a collective participatory process?

350 Primary and Secondary Education pupils from Elefsina, Athens, Thessaloniki, Germany, Albania, North Macedonia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Serbia and Kosovo will be meeting in Elefsina during a three-day Pupils' Conference, to provide answers to the above stated and many more questions.

Pupils are brought to the conference having received the required preparation at school, one which consists of four levels: a) processing the basic concepts related to the climate crisis, climate neutrality and actions that may lead to the reduction of the carbon footprint, b) study of the current situation of their school, neighborhood or city in terms of climate footprint, c) vision methodology, d) creation of a roadmap with a time horizon of 2030, to be presented at the pupils' conference in the form of a poster.

During the Pupils' Conference and through participatory democratic consultation, the pupils will propose solutions for Elefsina, after having toured the city, recognized the special features and challenges, and fully understood the human-environment interactions.

The solutions, with reference to the thematic routes of the city, will address the following topics: industry-energy, marine ecosystem and coastal front, buildings, urban environment and mobility, sustainable nutrition, waste management, cultural heritage-archeological site, people participation. During their tour of the city of Elefsina, through the built (architecture of spaces, settlements, etc.), the cultural (monuments, archaeological sites, etc.) and the social (spatial organization, economy, etc. etc.) environments, pupils will familiarise themselves with Elefsina and understand the interaction between humans and the environment, with the aim of bringing out proposals.

Proposals will emerge through group consultation and jointly created collective vision for a climate-neutral future. This collective vision will be visualized through art and will be offered as a gift to Elefsina and as a legacy for cultural capitals and other cities throughout Europe.

Agenda

Tuesday May 9, 2023 (1st day, Greek - English)

09.30 - 10.00: Arrival of delegates and registration at the conference

<u>10.00 – 10.30: Opening of the Conference</u> – Greeting by officials

<u>10.30 - 11.00 Knowing each other and interaction games</u> for delegates from Greece and other countries.

After the ceremony the international and Thessaloniki group of pupils will visit the City Hall and have an interactive guided exploration in order to acquainted with Elefsina and Cultural events occurring on that date.

11.00 - 12.30: Pupils' walks through the town.

The pupils of_1st, 3rd and West Attica Directorates participating on the first day of the conference, divided into groups together with the accompanying teachers and facilitators, walk the thematic routes related to the following sections:

- Active industry air and sea pollution
- Abandoned industrial buildings and reuse
- Re-designing the coastal front and rendering it to citizens
- Urban environment and mobility
- Green solutions for buildings and urban space
- Social cohesion and regional particularities
- Sustainable food and local produce

The children, through the thematic routes, familiarize themselves with the local environment of Elefsina, come into contact with possible problematic situations which they can photograph, or come across elements of sustainability which they can highlight. The collected material and the experience of the walk constitute the raw material for the delegates' consultation and the visioning of solutions for the transition of the city of Elefsina towards climate neutrality. On these routes, specially trained facilitators accompany the pupils' group, comment, give the required information and generally facilitate the participants so that they get to know the local environment.

12.30 - 13.00: Snack break at the X-Bowling Art Center.

<u>13.00</u> - <u>13.30</u>: <u>Presentations by experts.</u> The experts are people with knowledge related to the thematic field that will receive and answer questions with the aim of enriching the proposals of the pupils regarding climate neutrality in the thematic area of their expertise.

13.30 - 15.30: Visioning in thematic groups. The space of the X-Bowling Art Center has been configured in an appropriate way to host the pupils' consultation process and workshops. In each thematic group there are 15-18 pupils, who have walked the same path and collaborate with the help of a facilitator. The methodology that will be used in the thematic groups is the methodology of the World Café which requires the delegates grouping around 3-4 round tables. During the work, the pupils can turn to the expert in order to get help to answer their questions about their topic.

- The pupils, from 3 to 4 different schools, start by presenting the posters of their schools, which are already placed on the tables printed in A3 size paper and which present the proposals on climate neutrality for their school, neighbourhood or city. 16.00 - 17.00: Return to Athens.

The participants in the visioning of the first day are from the Primary schools: 8th Primary School of Philadelphia, 10th Primary School of Ilioupoli, 4th and 5th Primary School of Petroupoli, 39th Primary School of Peristeri, 4th and 7th Primary School of Elefsina.

The following steps are followed in detail:

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Wednesday 10 May 2023 (Day 2, English)

 $\underline{\textbf{10.00}}$ - $\underline{\textbf{11.30}}$: Pupils' walks through the town (Pupils from the East Thessaloniki Secondary Education Directorate, $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ Athens and West Attica Primary Education Directorates, German and Balkan Schools).

The children, through the thematic routes, familiarize themselves with the local environment of Elefsina, come into contact with possible problematic situations which they can photograph, or come across elements of sustainability which they can highlight. The collected material and the experience of the walk constitute the raw material for the delegates' consultation and the visioning of solutions for the transition of the city of Elefsina towards climate neutrality. <u>15.30 - 16.30: Closing and preparation for the next day.</u> Pupils and teachers synthesize the proposals that have emerged from the two days workshops.

The participants of the second day come from the schools: 1st and 3rd High School of Kalamaria, 1st High School of Pylaia, 2nd High School of Perea, 11th High School of Thessaloniki, 1st Primary School of Elefsina, 3rd Primary School of Zografou, Schweizerhof Elementary School (Germany), Wilhelm-von-Humboldt School (Germany), Temple-Grandin School (Germany), Private elementary school Tvrđava (Serbia), Rapatnica Primary School (Bosnia and Herzegovina), Slavko Lumbarkovski, Municipal Primary school (North Macedonia), Faik Konica Primary

and lower secondary school (Kosovo), Ismail Klosi (Albania).

Thursday 11 May 2023 (Day 3, English)

09.00 - 10.00: Summary of consultation results. A small delegation of pupils will consolidate the proposals that have emerged from the first and second day, classify them by thematic field, and produce a resolution.

10.00: Arrival of the delegations from the schools of Athens, the Balkans and Germany.

<u>10.00 - 10.30: Presentation of results and resolution.</u> Announcement of the consolidated proposals by topic the plenary session. Distribution of the resolution text to all groups.

10.30 - 12.45: Visualization of proposals through art.

The third day delegates are divided into groups and participate in one of the following workshops:

- a) Visual representation on map. The pupils mark on a map of Elefsina the thematic routes they took, add their ideas and suggestions for changes, and record their feelings.
- **b)** Construction of pickets. The pupils decide which slogans they want to include, write them on the pickets painted and prepared for use in a symbolic pupils' march to the City Hall at the end of the conference. The making of pickets with slogans for climate neutrality is an expression of the pupils' mood or intention for action.
- **c) Music workshop.** In the music workshop, the pupils write the lyrics of a song to a given melody and prepare it so that they can perform it at the end of the conference at the Town Hall.

- **d) Photography workshop.** The pupils create a real exhibition with images from Elefsina they have captured through their own lens. The printed photos will "acquire a voice" through captions, which will be created by the children and will be put on display, so that the residents of Elefsina can see them.
- **e) Art workshop.** With the help of a visual artist, the vision of the three-day pupils' consultation on climate neutrality is visualized through the use of mixed media.
- **f) Sculpture construction.** The pupils create a three-dimensional construction from recyclable materials which represents their vision for the climate neutrality of Elefsina.
- **g)** Theatrical action. The pupils express themselves with theatrical techniques on issues related to climate neutrality. The team physically represents the experiences gathered during the three days of the conference.
- h) Musical act and dance. Participatory creation of "Unification song" with lyrics containing words and phrases from participation in Mystery no.149 along with "circle movement" (circle dance), which highlights the messages of the unification song and instills feelings, meanings, experiences, memories, visions, bridging past-present-future, based on the participation of pupils in all activities.

12:45 - 13.00: Reflection and closing

Pupils will get together in a circle for one last moment of reflection, sharing emotions

13.00 - 13.30: Snack break

<u>13.30 - 14.30: Pupils' march to the City Hall.</u> Pupils walk using the pickets, stop in the square, perform the song and present the proposals of the Pupils' Conference for the transition to a climate neutral future to the Mayor and City Board of Elefsina.

Group 1 (VLYCHA)	INDUSTRY - ENERGY	The group will examine the issue of energy in relation to its production and use, alternative sources and conservation and will seek solutions for the transformation of local industry and cities in general aiming at a climate neutral Elefsina.
Group 2 (VLYCHA)	SEA- COAST- PUBLIC SPACE	The team will deal with the issue of the sea and the wetland, their protection as ecosystems for the absorption of CO ₂ and the return of the coastal front to the residents, with the aim of environmental revitalization of the area, mitigation and adaptation to climate change and upgrading the quality of life of the residents.
Group 3 (VLYCHA)		The team will examine the issue of the utilization of abandoned and reused industrial and other public and private buildings
Group 4 (KRONOS)	BUILDINGS	and their surroundings, through integrated or symbolic interventions in an energy-efficient and architecturally sustainable way, aiming at highlighting the history of the place and preserving historical memory in a climate-neutral course of the city.
Group 5 (KRONOS)	SEA	The team will deal with the issue of the sea, its protection as an ecosystem for the absorption of CO_2 , green transformation of its ports and maritime transportation, as well as giving back the coastal front to the inhabitants, aiming at the upgrading of life quality and transition to climate neutrality.
Group 6 (KRONOS)		The team will explore all issues of sustainable urban mobility, both within the city and in its connection to the cities of Athens
Group 7 (IRIS)	MOBILITY	and Piraeus, aiming at facilitating the lives of residents and visitors in climate-neutral ways.
Group 8 (IRIS)	WASTE	The team will deal with sustainable waste management (reduction-reuse-recycling) and the respective infrastructures of the city, aiming at Elefsina's transition to climate neutrality.

DESIGN METHODOLOGY

Beacon methodology has been utilized for the planning and implementation of the stages during the three days of the pupils' conference as follows:

Stage	Content
PREPARATION	Trails - Impressions and ideas collection, interaction with residents
ARRIVAL	Pupils' exploration and self-expression (what they liked/didn't like in connection with climate neutrality in the route they walked) (PRESENT)
SENSE	Display of photos from the past of Elefsina - discussion and connection with the present and transition to the vision for the future (PAST-FUTURE)
LEARNING	Investigation of specific questions in plenary for the city's climate neutrality, with the participation of specific experts per thematic section.
DESIGN	Planning a common vision and consultation of pupils per thematic area in small groups using the World Café method based on the emotional and cognitive data collected during the thematic routes in Elefsina.
DISSEMINATION	Presentation of the group vision to the other children of the conference and to the stakeholders in plenary (Mayor, local community, press and to other schools in the period following the conference).
